On the morning of February 9th, the Zeta chapter will initiate twenty-nine freshmen and two sophomores. With an average GPA of 3.97, ACT of 31, and SAT of 1330, the Pledge Class of 2023 consists of men that excelled in academics, athletics, community service, and involvement. 


BROTHER SPOTLIGHT


Max Raynor PC '23

The Little 500 cycling season is in full swing and the Zeta FIJI Little 500 team has been busy training. During the summer, the team was able to purchase well needed kits for the upcoming season. The team has been very blessed with consistent backing from graduate brothers. All the money used to purchase these new kits came from the continued support of the FIJI Cycling Boosters Club. Throughout the fall semester, graduate brother Charlie McClary PC '14 has been helping the team by developing weekly training schedules. Since August, senior members of the team have been cycling over 200 miles a week with junior members cycling around 150. The team has completed multiple rides spanning over 70 miles and plans to complete three 100 mile rides before the team's winter break trip.

The Zeta FIJI Little 500 Team will be traveling down to Gainesville, Florida for their annual winter break bike trip. The team will be there from January 4th through January 11th and plans to continue its hard work. The team is planning on cycling over 300 miles during the trip.

After the 2019 Little 500 Race, Captain Matt Cooper PC '21, was selected to be a part of Riders Council (RC). RC is the governing body of riders under the Indiana University Student Foundation (IUSF). Brother Cooper is the first Zeta FIJI to be selected to be on the council since 2013. During his time on the council this fall, Brother Cooper has helped develop a new philanthropy strategy for IUSF while actively teaching rookie riders bike safety. He is looking forward to teaching more rookie riders the importance of safety while also working with IUSF to help organize Quals and the 2020 Little 500 Race during the spring semester.
